1. H.E.A.L. wholeheartedly supports Shelter Animals Count efforts to create a national database of animals in our nation's shelters.
2. As an animal sanctuary, with majority of our rescues home with us for life and rescue-group-and-owner-requested temporary fosters, H.E.A.L. does not truly match the Basic Data Matrix used by Shelter Animals Count very well.
3. H.E.A.L. Sanctuary's parent organization Joey's Elder Paws Rescue also administers Joey's Fund with the aim is to keep pets out of shelters by helping families and approved 501(c)(3) rescues with vet bills and rehab expenses. This data has been captured in a separate category (Assistance with Veterinary Bills and Rehabilitation Expenses).
4. Nevertheless, H.E.A.L. believes it is important to use the matrix where possible to promote comparability and compatibility with Shelter Animals Count Data.
5. This chart does not include other rescued animals excluding cats and dogs at H.E.A.L. Sanctuary.
